Summer of Tennis

What a Summer of Tennis it was. The ATP Cup, the Aussie Open and the 2020 Australian Seniors Tennis Championships. Whilst most club members were ensconced in watching the ATP Cup a stalwart band of around a dozen NTC members joined over 1000 players competing in the latter tournament held in Busselton in early January.

Frank Sweeney, Dave Mofflin, Steve Hollier, Tony Morgan and Mike Nowak (referred to as "The Men's team") competed in the Men's over 60s team event. Nathalie Smalberger, Janet Ferriera, Ruhi Lacey, Barbara Nowak and Helen Morgan (referred to as "The Women's team") competed in the Ladies over 50s team event. Peter Schmitt (rather bravely) joined a group of men largely unknown to him to compete in the Men's over 70s team event and Kon Kozak is to be congratulated for supporting his more talented half, Judy, through the teams event and all the way to the semi-final of the Ladies over 60s singles. The 'Men's' and 'Ladies' teams could not have been more different in all aspects.

The men were led by the laconic, but highly organised and experienced team captain of 3 previous Australian Seniors Championships campaigns, Frank Sweeney, whereas the women had to rely on the inexperienced but highly focused (some would say bossy) yours truly to lead them in their campaign.

The men had a large team of 9 including an injured Richard Clarke whose job it was to look after the PR and media commitments of the team. The team chose a strategy of focusing on golf, playing at a different golf course each day, in order to take the pressure off their tennis performances.

The women, with a small team of 5 (we all know President Janet never likes to sit off) could not afford any injury and focused single mindedly on the tennis. Nathalie Smalberger competed in just about every set on every day and arguably played the most tennis out of any entrant in the team's competition. The expression in the photo tells it all.

The men chose to stay in a secluded location deep in the heart of the Ludlow forest (think "Deliverance") much to the amazement of a number of eastern states players who had just managed to escape the rampant bushfires in the east in order to attend the tourna-

ment.

The Ladies also chose a secluded location but one situated on the coast to allow for post-match ocean cool downs and strenuous beach running activities (as illustrated) to maintain their fitness in the little time they had off.

Winding Wildwood road had the team "in the zone" for playing winning tennis by the time they arrived at the venue each day. They were sufficiently psyched up with the adrenalin pumping but in no danger of succumbing to nerves on account of being so relieved to have arrived safely at the courts – playing tennis seemed like a breeze in comparison to the nerve racking drive.

When not playing the men chose to live in seclusion, not attend any of the official events and to

use their culinary skills to prepare all of their own meals.

The women on the other hand attended official functions (well at least one) making an effort to doll themselves up with you know who looking spectacular in "Camilla" and on the advice of club member Jane Edwards chose a healthy vegan diet mostly prepared by others.

The women being in an 8 pool event where it was imperative to win most matches to be able to compete in the playoff between the first and second team focused on winning every match from the get go.







The competition in which the men played allowed Captain Frank the luxury of tanking early matches by playing his weakest team thereby lulling the opposition into a false sense of security so that they were completely overcome later in the week in

the replay match when Frank fielded his strongest team. This strategy allowed them to somehow make the finals.


This was very disconcerting for the women who having won every match faced the



Dear Members,

On behalf of the Committee I am pleased to advise we have implemented Tennis Australia's online court booking software 'Book a Court'.

The system allows members and casual players to book courts and ensures lights automatically turn on for night bookings. This system is aimed at increasing the utilization of the courts by improving the ability of casual players to hire and access courts at times when they are not booked by members, coaches or reserved for club events such as Saturday social tennis, junior tennis and League tennis.

While the system represents a change to how we currently manage the courts, we believe it will be of benefit to our members with increased revenue re-invested in facilities or club programs. For the club to maintain a solid financial position we need to broaden its revenue base and grow its court hire revenue.

To be able to book a court, you will need to register with Book a Court. Over the next week you will receive an invitation to register via email. Please ensure you register using the link in the invitation, as this is how the system will recognise you as a member and ensure you receive discounted member pricing (member court bookings are free other than a \$5/hr hire fee for night play under lights).

We encourage all members to get in the habit of booking their courts to avoid disappointment and allow us to better monitor court use and hire by non-members.

Effective immediately members (one per any playing group) will need to book courts to be certain of having access to a court at peak times - especially hard courts for evening or night use. Where a member or casual player has a court booked at an allotted time they take precedence, irrespective of whether players on the court have finished.

You will not need to book courts for organized club events or League Tennis, the courts will be reserved for those times by the relevant club coordinator.

The Book-a- Court system will also automatically activate the lights where courts are booked after sunset. When a court is booked a 4 digit pin number is issued to the person making the booking. When the pin number is entered for a court booking with lights, the lights will come on automatically after sunset. If the pin is not entered the lights will not go on.

The pin pad is located on the front wall of the clubhouse, to the right of Men's Toilet door, as shown in the photo below. For play under lights it is important to enter the pin number issued with the booking prior to commencing play, even if the courts are already in use, otherwise the lights will go off automatically.







For members would like a demonstration of the system we will provide these on Saturday 7th March and Saturday $14^{\rm th}$ March at the end of social tennis.
