Every team sport that is played has training and game day, unfortunately we don't always have that opportunity for all our players.

In Term 4 we are going to start offering a Singles ladder for our players, this will hopefully create more opportunities for our league players to train in matches, our squad players to practice point play and our players who have other obligations on Sunday mornings, a chance to play competition. Team Tennis is our entry level doubles competition embracing modified rules for new players and providing coach feedback on positioning and basic tactics to enable our new league players and our new to matchplay HotShots kids, a great stepping stone into tennis matches. UNDERSTANDING OUR PATHWAYS

Here at Tennis HQ our goal is to share our passion for the sport of tennis with as many players as we can, our coaches have grown up playing and loving the game and we look forward to sharing that with our players. This is a wonderful life lesson for their futures as they take on the ownership of academic performance, social skills and future career success.

For those players who are looking to take their tennis to a more competitive level we offer our Talent programs which are invitation only classes for those Hot Shots players who are showing improving skills and enthusiasm for the sport. These talent players are usually starting to compete in league teams or introductory level tournaments.

This year we introduced our Academy programs for hand selected juniors at orange, green and yellow ball level for players for whom tennis is their priority sport and are looking to compete in points tournaments. The term so far has exceeded expectations on the hard work and effort put in by our first batch of players. We are really excited about this new program and are looking forward to seeing more competitive tennis at NTC
