In mid-November we hosted Reabold Tennis Club for our annual 'social' tennis event which was a glorious afternoon of great tennis and good company, in spite of the fact Reabold were victorious. Our league season got underway the following week with Nedlands being represented by 18 senior and 18 junior teams in Tennis West competition.

The first of our Club Champs Round Robin events at the end of November was hotly contested but unfortunately rained off in the latter stages. This caused a bit of a furore and required some players to return the following week to settle the score with sheep stations up for grabs. Our second event in early January, with over 50 players, was less eventful but nonetheless embraced by all participants. Christmas at the club this year had an Australian flavour with glazed ham and salads on offer.

With the start of 2021 our preparations for our annual Australian Ranking and Money Tournament began in earnest. We were very excited to be holding this event again as, due to Covid, there had been no such tournaments since March last year.

We have recently applied for a Community Sporting & Recreation Facilities Fund Grant for the upgrading of our synthetic courts however, we are not overly optimistic as this process is extremely competitive, the project is not regarded as a high priorty by the Department of Sport & Recreation and the life cycle costs of synthetic courts relative to plexipave are very high. We are also in the process of applying for a Heritage Grant for some structural works and painting required on the club house and seeking a contribution from the City of Nedlands for refurbishing our kitchen.

With a couple of months of the summer season remaining now is the time to take advantage of our beautiful grass courts which are playing well. You will be glad to hear that this year we will be keeping 6 grass courts open throughout the winter which will alleviate court shortages at peak times and provide us with more options.

Finally I would like to encourage you all to think about having a go in our upcoming Club Championships over the Labour Day long weekend. This may well be your moment to shine or at least stack yourself up against your fellow members!

TIP OF THE MONTH – ACCEPTING ERRORS

The most common finish to a rally in tennis is an unforced error, around 70 percent of the time, no matter what level of player you are! So how can this be? Surely better players make fewer errors? The most common reason people come for tennis lessons is the desire to make less errors on court.

The truth is that the quality of the made shots is not accounted for in the search for error reduction. If you compare yourself to a player above your level who you may aspire to be more like, they probably make fewer errors than you do, when they play at your level. However put them against a player at their level and you will find they will make errors with the same frequency you will when you play someone at your level.

The key to understanding this is that as you improve as a player, you also increase your expectations. Once you can hit the ball harder, deeper, closer to lines, you aspire to hit the ball harder, deeper and even closer to lines. With the desire to improve and play at the new level comes an element of risk and a loss of control to perform the more difficult strokes.

The final important point is understanding WHEN errors occur. A beginner player might make an error every second shot, an intermediate player every fourth shot and an advanced player ever sixth shot as an example. So we can see if we set up some dummy match scenarios how errors might play out.

Beginner vs Beginner : we would expect an error every second shot. Average rally length 1-2 strokes. Beginner vs Intermediate : the intermediate can generally hit three strokes in a row but the beginner cannot, so we expect the beginner to make an error off of one of the three strokes hit in by the intermediate. Average rally length 2-4 strokes. Intermediate vs Intermediate : with both players able to rally longer before the error we see "more tennis" but in the end an error will occur after three of four made shots. Average rally length 3 – 5 strokes.

So you can see the rally length capacity shall surely increase with increasing ability, however making an error on the second shot verses the eighth shot does not affect the outcome which still gets recorded as one error. Therefore working with this logic, every ball you don't make an error from is one more opportunity your opponent has to make the error.



Labour Day Long Weekend

- All rounds of the Championship Events, except the finals, will be run over the March Labour Day long weekend. Entrants for the Championship Events MUST be available on Saturday Feb 27, Sunday Feb 28 and Monday Mar 1, and then on Saturday 27 March if you are likely to be playing in the finals.
- It is planned to have a round of each championship event (singles, doubles and mixed doubles) on the Saturday, Sunday and Monday afternoons of the long weekend from midday; however, it will be assumed that players are also available to play should it be necessary to schedule matches in the morning.
- Exemptions for short periods of time for important events may be requested on the entry form and attempts will be made to accommodate these exemptions if possible to do so without impacting on the progress of the draw. Please be sensible about exemption requests. For example it is unlikely to be possible to grant exemptions to players entering more than one event. Exemptions requested after the draw has been completed and match times advertised will not be considered.
- Championship events will be a knock out draw with a consolation event for first round losers of the men's and ladies' singles if numbers permit.
- All entrants must be financial members of the club
