Another one bites the dust...NTC's annual hosting of a tournament (or two) has been and gone. By all accounts it was a success, not the least for the Weather Gods that shone bright on us during those four days of the Tennis Seniors Tournament WA on April 21 -24. We had a very high participation rate from our members and some successful outcomes.

Congratulations to David Rees and Brid Dawson-Najem for winning their respective mixed doubles division. We also had a few runners up in their respective doubles divisions: Gary Hing and Richard Clarke, as well as Direshni Bennett and Liz Schmitt. Runners up in the mixed doubles in their division was Suresh Sakar and Susan Tay. Stjepan Maticevic was very busy playing three events and did a great effort to be runner up in his Group in the Men's Singles event. Many other members participated with various degrees of success, but unanimously enjoyed participating.

As in any successful event, it cannot happen without the mobilisation of an army of volunteers. As usual our roster was quickly filled in by our many members, who put up their hand for the cause. The cause is a worthy one – not only does the club hosting the event promote the game of tennis, which is our core raison d'être, but in doing so, it assists the club greatly when we apply for grants for future development. It shows NTC as an active and vibrant community club worthy of support. It also acts as an important fund raiser for the club and, by extension, is of benefit to its members.

The net profit from the TSWA was just short of \$ 5,000 over 4 days. It was made predominantly from canteen and bar sales, and some from club and court hire fees. This amount raised without having entry fees (Tennis West ran the Tournament) is an absolute almighty effort. We thank, in no particular order: Jenny Jones, Trish Heath and Direshni Bennett for their sublime baking that complimented the canteen fare of healthy and delicious offerings, Rachel Palmer for having the canteen ticking better than the finest Swiss watch. 
These events make good revenue for the club but entail a lot of work by the volunteers.

Outside on the verandah are roughly 40 adults getting ready to compete in the 2023 State Senior event, the club is looking spick and span with hard work from our groundsman and club volunteers. Courts are looking pristine and there are a number of players out on them warming up. With a number of our volunteers at the bar, on the BBQ and in the kitchen the club is a busy place today. It's great to be a part of it.

#### JUNIOR LEAGUE

We had another successful summer season with 17 junior teams competing from first time orange ball players to our Junior State League girls team. We had three teams take home the league wins, congratulations go to all players but special mention to our winners:

David has been a member his whole tennis life, coached by myself, then worked as an assistant coach for a number of years. Upon enjoying his coaching he completed his accreditation and took on a senior role with Tennis HQ. He has been an integral part of our coaching team for ten years but it is now time for him to pursue other opportunities. We wish him all the best for his future endeavours.

**TIP OF THE MONTH** – There are two common "errors" in the majority of players out there at social tennis each week; these are some bad habits that players could take steps to improve to help their games.

#1. Late preparation; so often players are not getting their racquet into a position where they can easily accelerate into the ball, early preparation is not as simple as taking your racquet behind your body, but can include footwork and movement and balance. The most important part of preparation is tracking the ball and watching it leave your opponent's racquet; there are signs are there about where the ball is most likely to go and therefore where you should be and what shot you should play. Your tactical planning for your stroke execution is based on all the options available to you and the sooner you recognise where the ball is going to be in you court the sooner you can plan for your next stroke.

Once you see that ball heading toward you, pick your stroke and use an upper body turn to get your body and racquet prepared WHILE you move, then when you reach the ball you'll have nothing left to do but smack a beautiful shot!
